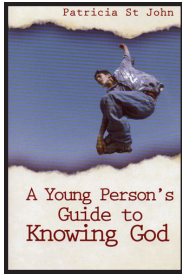

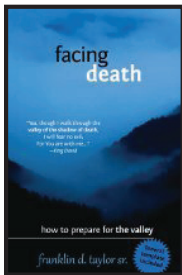

At a young age, Patricia St. John learned to love God by reading His book. Now she has written this little guide book in order to encourage and help you understand God's ultimate guide book - the Bible.

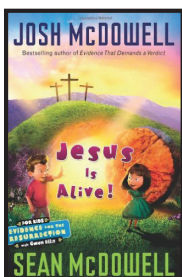

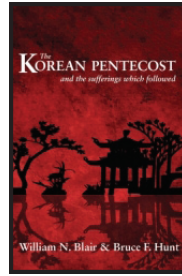

The Korean Pentecost and the Sufferings Which Followed by William Blair & Bruce Hunt – Call Number: C51 (Biography shelf)

It describes the remarkable way in which Korea was first prepared to receive the gospel and how the gospel first came to the country through ones like Robert Thomas. Thomas

was with a group who had come under fire and who then waded ashore from their burning ship. Unlike the others in the party who tried to defend themselves, Thomas sought to give out Bibles to those who would take his life. A few of these copies were hidden and read leading to the eventual conversion of some.

The book then shows the remarkable progress the gospel made through the labours of American missionaries in the later part of the 19th and early 20th centuries. It is very challenging to see how missionaries were willing to be utterly spent in their concern to travel extensively through the land spreading the gospel and strengthening churches.

The events of the 1907 revival give this book its title – The Korean Pentecost... There can be no doubt that as a result of prayer, a remarkable work of God's Spirit was done, whereby pastors and hundreds of believers, up and down the length of Korea, were brought to a heightened sense of God's presence and a consequent confession of sin and a desire to make the gospel known.

This blessing and preparation preceded what became an intense period of suffering for the churches of Korea, first under the Japanese and then from the Communists.

The book describes the remarkable struggle where the enemies of God did all within their power to destroy or limit the testimony to the gospel. The faithfulness and resolve of so many, amidst harrowing suffering, resulting in many sealing their witness with their blood, shows the power of God in sustaining His people.

We know so little of such suffering. Yet it is unsettling to ask if we know anything of the zeal of those whose witness is recorded in this book – men and women who were willing to declare their allegiance to Christ, even when facing torture and death.

This book surely gives us a glimpse of what many believers suffer in North Korea today and stirs us to use our freedoms all the more for the furtherance of the gospel and to pray for those who are in chains (<http://mcbcs.springroad.org.uk>).
