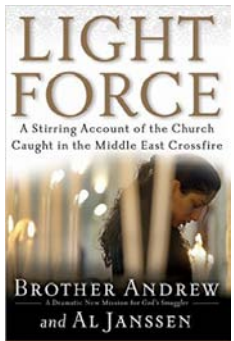


## SPARKY SHINES HIS LIGHT

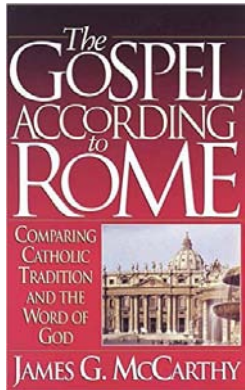


## LIGHT FORCE

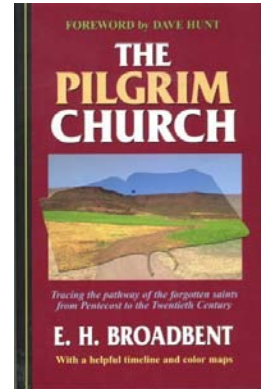


**THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO ROME** by James McCarthy – Call Number: T17 (Cults and World Religions shelf)
