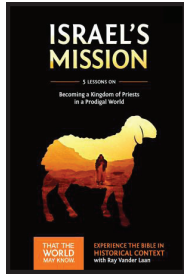

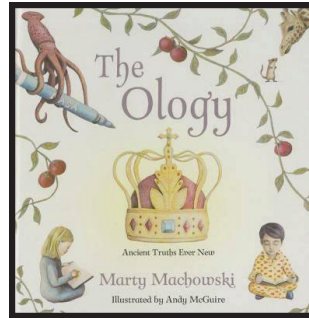
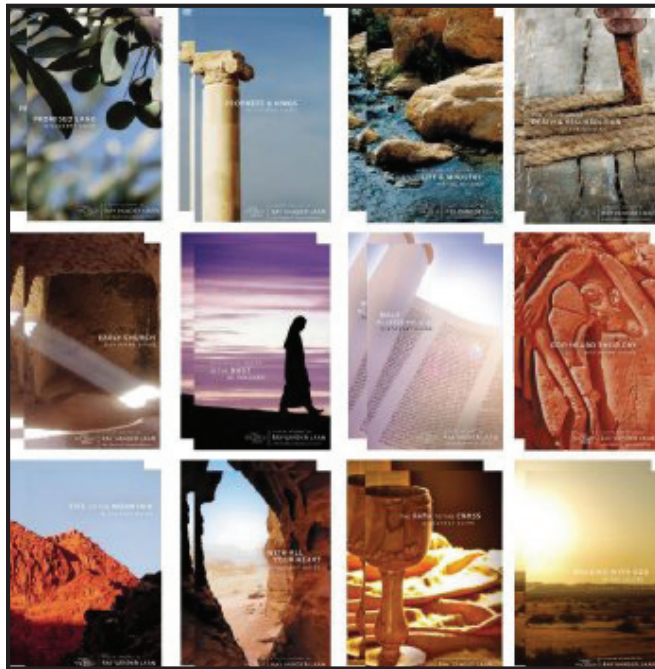
That the World May Know (Vol 13): Israel's Mission by Ray Vander Laan - Call Number: DVD.F1.13 (DVD shelf)

The chapel library also have volumes 1-12 of this series.

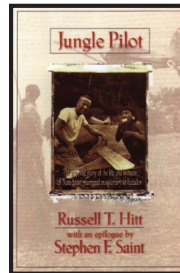


The Ology: Ancient Truths Ever New by Marty Machowski - Call Number: D65 (Children shelf)

In the cellar of an old stone cathedral, two children discover an ancient book called The Ology. The beautifully illustrated storybook ushers them into a story of adventure, mystery, and wonder in which they discover life-changing truths about God, themselves, and the world around them. This new edition tells the original story and then brings it up to date through the epilogue and time line written by Nate's son, Stephen, who recently returned to the jungles of Ecuador to see and record the remarkable progress in the work pioneered by Nate and his missionary friends (christianbook.com).
