HE MAKETH ME TO LIE DOWN IN GREEN PASTURES

The relationship between the sheep and the shepherd in the Bible is a picture of the relationship between Christ (the Shepherd) and the believer (the sheep). In Ps 100: 3 we read '... we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture.' Isa. 53:6 tells us 'All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way'

However, in Ps 23:2 we have a picture of satisfaction and peace for the sheep that stay close to the Shepherd. "He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters." In Hebrew Ps. 23:2 looks like this

בְּנֵאוֹת דֶּשֶׁא יִרְבִּיצֵנִי עַל-מִי מְנַחֹת יִנְהַלְנִי :

Hebrew is read right to left and so we'll look at the first three words. בְּנֵאוֹת means 'in oases of'. דֶּשֶׁא vegetation and יִרְבִּיצֵנִי 'He is - making - recline -me. Putting the definitions together the thought is 'In Oases of vegetation He is making -recline-me.

The world can never satisfy, as it does not have the vegetation sheep need. As we feed on the Word of God

we're feeding on an oases of 'rich' vegetation. Vegetation for sheep! Sheep graze from about 3:30 in the morning until about 10:00. They then lie down for three or four hours to rest. They are at peace, secure and are satisfied. The Shepherd cares for us - 'He maketh me to lie down in green pastures ...! Knowing this, is to be secure and satisfied. We need to feed in the rich oasis of the Word of God; then rest and meditate on what was read. This will satisfy and bring peace.

The nature of the Shepherd is one of - Compassion, Matthew 9:36 'But when he saw the multitudes, he was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd.' - Care for his flock of sheep, Isaiah 40:11. He shall feed his flock like a shepherd: he shall gather the lambs with his arm, and carry them in his bosom, and shall gently lead those that are with young. And - Courage, John 10:11-13. "I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep. But he that is an hireling, and not the shepherd, whose own the sheep are not, seeth the wolf coming, and leaveth the sheep, and fleeth: and the wolf catcheth them, and scattereth the sheep. The hireling fleeth, because he is an hireling, and careth not for the sheep."

We, His sheep, need to stay close to the Shepherd. The greater the distance, the greater the danger. 'He maketh me to lie down in green pastures...'

May these few brief thoughts encourage us to feed daily in the rich oasis of God's word.

But God the Father guided me to your house yesterday and gave me this opportunity. I'm so grateful for it. I have brought your Bible back."

A More Sure Word

"We have also a more sure word of prophecy; whereunto ye do well that ye take heed, as unto a light that shineth in a dark place, until the day dawn, and the day star arise in your hearts." (2 Peter 1:19)

In this important passage, Peter explains the ultimate source of his writings. He did not merely repeat cunningly devised fables when he taught majestic things about the Lord Jesus Christ, but was himself an "eyewitness" of His glory and personally heard the very voice of God on the Mount of Transfiguration (vv. 16-18). The three chosen disciples witnessed His prophesied glory and heard God speak of Christ's pleasing Sonship. There

could be no doubt of God's special plan for His Son. As eyewitnesses, they bore the onus of bearing witness to the facts.

But Peter downplayed the importance of his own personal testimony, even though it was a firsthand account and quite important, and he knew it was absolutely correct. The "more sure word of prophecy" he recommended, however, which outshines any human testimony, was the written Word of God, for the Transfiguration confirmed numerous Old Testament prophecies concerning Christ. Prophecies already fulfilled multiply our confidence in the rest of Scripture.

Oral or written testimony of human observers, no matter how trustworthy they may be, is still subject to human error and not "inerrant" in the same way as Scripture. Christians must always remember that the written Word of God is more certain than personal memories or impressions. The experiences we have must never be viewed as validating God's Word. Rather, God's Word validates our experiences. The early church only had a few portions of the New Testament in those days of beginning, but thankfully, we have it all and have ready access to it. Peter recognized it as superior to any personal testimony. How much more should we deem it trustworthy and authoritative?

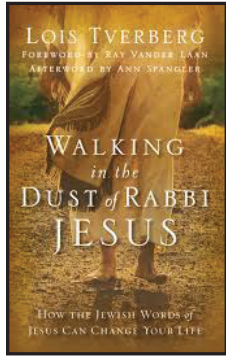

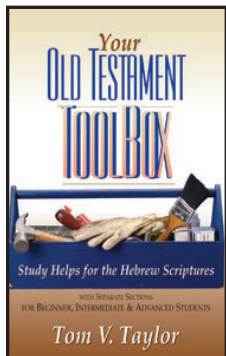

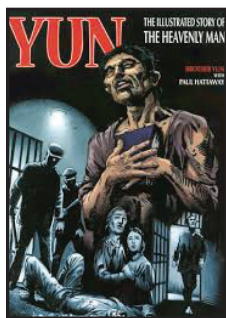
Walking in the Dust of Rabbi Jesus: How the Jewish Words of Jesus Can Change Your Life

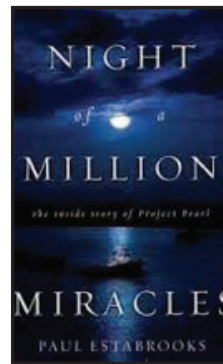
Yun: The Illustrated Story of the Heavenly Man
