PRAYER & PRAISE JUNE 9, 2014

Dear saints:

Our sister Pearl has been with our Lord for 6 weeks now. Imagine how happy "our Pearl" is now!

In her home town assembly in North Bay, we did enjoy a precious time at her memorial service on May 15th. Pearl had a friend in Dr. Cynthia Bullen, "that lit up Pearl's room" as she visited her adopted mother. Cynthia spoke of her special relationship with Pearl & how that affected Cynthia's life. Our elders, Ken Ferron & Randy Bushey both described Pearl's life from a spiritual & physical perspective.

The chapel was full & we then drove to the Forest Lawn cemetery in the rain about 6 km distant. It poured on the way up there but dropped to a shower when we assembled at the tombstone for the committal service.

Then we drove back to the chapel for refreshments & fellowship. Pearl's up to date book collection was on display as well as some other wall pictures, plaques, African figurines. Anyone was free to take a memento of Pearl from her personal display.

We were very fortunate to have saints travel from Southern Ont. Drs. Philip & Nancy Woods, just back 2 weeks from Nyankunde, gave a personal testimony to the value in the work God permitted Pearl to achieve in the Tchabi area. They stated that Pearl developed many assemblies in the Tchabi area & in terms of numbers no one did that better than our sister. Pearl was also very well respected in her medical knowledge & experience in the hospital at Tchabi. Visiting doctors from abroad would often seek her advice on maladies they were not familiar with.

Our sister Pearl always expected to live out her life in Africa & she had planted a special tree at Tchabi for her burial site. This fact is well known at Tchabi & everyone knows the spot she chose. Thru the process of cremation, we were able to accomplish this.

Val & Marg drove to Dubuque in Iowa, USA in order to meet our brother Dr. Katho, May 26th & pass along some of Pearl's ashes. Brother Katho was attending an Emmaus conference at the Bible School there. He arrived in Bunia today & her ashes will be taken to Tchabi for burial. We have been made aware of the huge desire of the saints in Tchabi to be able to bury their own missionary on the mission station. This will be a special occasion to have Pearl back in this way for burial. They expect 500 from the Tchabi area alone with many others coming from around that area of DRC.

Brother Katho states that "he is aware of our responsibility to continue with what Pearl started here". To this end, we have seen our Lord provide financially for the replacement truck, replacement computer, replacement cell phone & 10 more sewing machines, & supply needed staff in the driver /mechanic & his wife recently moved from Nyankunde to Tchabi. Both of them are a large help in the spiritual work of the Tchabi assembly. Brother Beli has proven himself to be a capable servant of the Lord as he leads the Tchabi assembly.

Pearl became very concerned around Christmas time that the work would carry on after her passing.

Missionary Service Committee in Toronto have kindly offered to maintain the conduit we now use to transfer funds to Tchabi. We invite all those who have an interest in reaching the lost in the Tchabi area to continue supporting that work. All donations for Pearl, sister Joici, brother Beli & brother Katho may be sent to MSC & CMML as in the past.

It is my desire to issue regular bulletins to keep everyone informed of the status of the Tchabi assembly & acknowledge all gifts of financial support. This was Pearl's desire also as she recently saw many new saints interested in the gospel presentation in the Tchabi area.

God has called us to be "workers together"....let us carry on!


Psychology and the Church Call Number: DVD.S2
