A TEACHER & A TRACT

Mary was in trouble. For years she had left Gospel tracts on her desk for the students in the algebra class she taught. A lawyer on the school board had vowed to have her fired because of her overt Christian witness, and when he was elected president of the school board, he made good on his threat.

Fighting her dismissal, Mary finally got her job back after six months. In a strange turn of events, she discovered that the board members who had lobbied for her dismissal were themselves guilty of certain misdeeds, and they were in turn dismissed from the board—including the hostile lawyer. Again he vowed that he would one day ruin her and that his children would never be allowed in her classes. Months later Mary attended the funeral of a student at her school. She arrived late and was seated next to the irate law-

yer! Though uncomfortable, Mary felt compelled to hand the lawyer one of the tracts she always had in her purse. The only one she had happened to be written by a Christian lawyer. Time passed, and at the beginning of a new semester the lawyer's daughter was assigned to Mary's algebra class. Mary told the lawyer's daughter that she should be assigned to another teacher, in keeping with her father's wishes. Smiling broadly, the lawyer's daughter said that would not be necessary, for her father had accepted Jesus Christ as his Saviour because of Mary's faithful witness and because of the tract that she had handed him that day at the funeral!

Mary's story is current, plucked fresh from our contemporary culture. Her testimony, like that of so many others, is that God is still honouring the distribution of Gospel literature today, just as He has done for centuries.

Are Elders' Ever Wrong? by Chuck Gianotti

Are elders ever wrong or do they make mistakes? The question sounds somewhat ludicrous, doesn't it? Of course, elders are sometimes wrong and can certainly make mistakes, despite the most sincere efforts and prayer. That being true, what does an elder do when he is wrong?

Keep in mind, the rest of the congregation probably knows when you are wrong. I believe they can handle that. The real issue for them is —how do you handle things when you are wrong?

The first step is to honestly admit

it to yourself and then to the Lord. Next, quickly admit it to those affected. Many are the jokes about politicians who deny or "spin" what everyone knows to be true. This shouldn't be the case for spiritual leaders.

If James 5:16 applies to all Christians, it behooves elders to lead the way: "Confess your sins to each other..." This includes asking forgiveness, if necessary.

What does this accomplish? First, you become more credible in the eyes of others, because they see that you are not teaching people what you yourself don't put into practice. Rather than making you look weak, it shows you to be a

humble, faithful leader.

Second, dealing with reality is always better than embracing falsehood. The sooner you admit your fault, the sooner you can move ahead in truth.

Third, the time otherwise wasted defending yourself can be better spent ministering to others.

Having had much experience in being wrong, I have found the best thing to do when wrong is quickly admit it, seek forgiveness and move ahead in the work.

deeply involved in medical work, just a mobile clinic when he gets out teaching in the villages, etc. Joel and Kaleigh Griffin are now home in New Brunswick awaiting their third little one ... and will apply for their visas while here. ... I still have a little input in the work by proofreading some of the EPI Portuguese books. ... My health is good in general, but I would like to walk better. I still use a cane to have balance and even with that I don't move very fast...But my eyes are good now so that is a great help.

From a MAF missionary pilot in a restricted-access country

How does MAF operate in countries that are openly hostile to those with a strong Christian witness"? The same way we began in many of the countries we openly serve in today; by building relationships among local populations, and trust among community leaders.

It's in one of these restricted-access countries that MAF recently opened our highest elevation airstrip yet. At 13,300 feet, it's in an area so extreme and barren, it's hard to imagine that over 2,500 people call this place home. With a life expectancy less than 40 years and an extremely high infant and maternal mortality rate, it is nearly impossible to live in such conditions.

One of the first MAF pilots to fly to this remote strip summed up his experiences. "I am not exaggerating when I say they need almost everything at this point. They lack education, nutrition, health care, and any access to the Good News. They are the poorest people I have ever met."

In this rugged mountain range, winter lasts for six months out of the year, with chest-high snow and temperatures that dip to -40°C. MAF flights will only be able to make it here during the summer months, yet even this brief window of opportunity will allow us to demonstrate the love of God to these people in such desperate

need. The importance of this new strip is not lost on the MAF pilot who first arrived by foot; "It means so much to me that this airstrip will open access to a completely unreached people who are in such dire need of help."






