I did not know what to reply at the time but the question kept coming back to me for the following three weeks. After a while I realized that what I found most difficult in my ministry was: EVERYTHING! I love what I do and feel privileged to work full-time for the Lord, but the pastoral load, with all that this implies, becomes heavy to bear after a while, especially if we lose sight of the true priorities, which is what happened to me. 

THE THREE KINDS OF FEAR

In the Scriptures the word "fear" may be used to describe the reaction a person might be expected to have in response to at least three different situations. If surrounded by enemies it would be equal to terror; David said, "fear is on every side...they scheme to take away my life" (Ps. 31:13). On the other hand Moses commanded respect to be shown to parents by saying, "Every one of you shall fear his mother and his father" (Lev. 19:3), and Jeremiah was advocating reverence as being rightfully due to the Lord when he exclaimed, "Who would not fear You, O King of the nations... "inasmuch as there is none like You, O Lord (You are great, and Your name is great in might)" (10:6). Too often these days we hear of people who were abused by one or both of their parents. In such cases it is understandable if the mention of fear along with the word father might recall moments of terror. But the way the Holy Spirit has chosen to express things will not change. Scripture does not separate the idea of fear (respect) from human fatherhood or from the fatherly role of God. Malachi 1:6 makes this clear. The latter involves an awe expressed in reverence, worship, unquestioning submission, and separation from every form of evil.

When in the New Testament we read, "perfect love casts out fear" (1 Jn. 4:18), it obviously does not mean the one who believes in Christ as his or her Saviour should throw the idea of due respect to the winds

and become chummy with God; thinking of Him as a pal. [...]

THE MEANING OF HOLINESS

Believers in Christ are called saints or holy ones; "it is not an attainment, it is a state into which God in His grace calls men; yet (they) are called to sanctify themselves (consistently with their calling, 2 Tim. 1:9), cleansing themselves from all defilement, forsaking sin, living a holy manner of life... and experiencing fellowship with God in His holiness" (W.E. Vine). This personal cleansing and forsaking or practical holiness, is our subject. You cannot convince me you are a saint by His calling if you are not, at the same time, also yearning to become more like the holy One you say is your Saviour. Peter charges us to act as "obedient children, not conforming yourselves to the former lusts, as in your ignorance; but as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, because it is written, 'Be holy for I am holy.' And if you call on the Father, who without partiality judges according to each one's work, conduct yourselves throughout the time of your stay here in fear..." (1 Peter 1:14-17).

IS CHRIST EMINENT OR IMMANENT?

We do not often use those words but we should think deeply about their meaning. He is both in fact. Firstly, God has exalted Him far above all so He is pre-eminent. Secondly, He is ever with us and so also immanent. We confess both, but fail at times to live our lives in the light of the fact that the Lord of all is also Lord of us in a special way. And this One who is everywhere (Ps 139) and thus immanent, graciously comes to and abides with His own in a unique way (Jn. 14:22,23 & Heb. 13:5,6). [...]

THE PROBLEMS WE FACE

Our minds can easily become overwhelmed by thoughts that we intended to consider perhaps for only a moment - to become angry, to gossip or lust. We open the door to see who was knocking, so to speak, and find a visitor has entered and taken over control and it seems impossible to get rid of him; we keep on thinking about the same things over and over. This is a common human experience and often the outcome of what we have heard someone talk about, we have read, or watched on television. This ability to imagine doing something we consider (sinfully) desirable that has invaded the mind is fuel for our sinful flesh, rendering it impossible to make good moral choices. [...]

Before Jesus physically left His followers He told them it was actually to their advantage for Him to go away (Jn. 16:7). He would "ask the Father, and He would give them 'another' Helper". (He chose the Greek word for another that meant another One exactly like Himself). He would stay with them and be in them (14: 16,17). In this way He would be with them "to the end of the age" (Matt. 28:20). So the potential to become increasingly holy in conduct is yours. [...]

As for the the question heading this article, we will let one scripture give the final word:

"I will be a Father to you, and you shall be My sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty. Therefore, having these promises beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all defilement of flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God." (2 Cor. 6:18 – 7:1.)

Letter from Doris Pitman - In Quebec - April 1,2014

I do appreciate your continued fellowship with me in the literature ministry for Chokwe believers. It motivates me to persevere.

This gift ... is being sent to The Angolan Literature Fund in England as **THERE ARE NO CANADIAN OR U.S. MISSIONARIES IN ANGOLA** and the young fellow who looks after these details in Luanda for Ruth Hadley who lives 600 miles inland says some of the Chokwe commentaries, courses and study books are out of print or nearly so. She will see to having them reprinted. ...

Apart from a Brazilian couple, **Ruth Hadley** is our only assembly missionary in Angola at the present time and has just returned to the field following a short period in England to have her broken ankle repaired. However, **Samuel Simonyi-Gindele** and family have just received their visas and are preparing to cross the border from Zambia where he has been assisting in the work while waiting. This is an encouragement. Also **Joel and Kaleigh Griffin** are in Portugal studying Portuguese prior to going on to Angola. How our hearts rejoice to know that there are younger couples exercised about serving the Lord in Angola.
