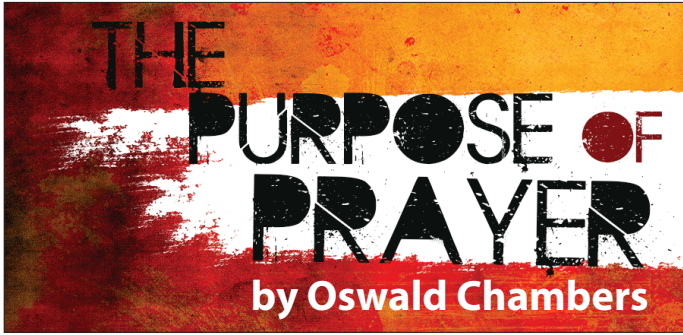

“One of His disciples said to Him, ‘Lord, teach us to pray . . .’” —Luke 11:1

Prayer is not a normal part of the life of the natural man. We hear it said that a person’s life will suffer if he doesn’t pray, but I question that. What will suffer is the life of the Son of God in him, which is nourished not by food, but by prayer. When a person is born again from above, the life of the Son of God is born in him, and he can either starve or nourish that life. Prayer is the way that the life of God in us is nourished. Our common ideas regarding prayer are not found in the New Testament. We look upon prayer simply as a means of getting things for ourselves, but the biblical purpose of prayer is that we may get to know God Himself.

“Ask, and you will receive . . .” (John 16:24). We complain before God, and sometimes we are apologetic or indifferent to Him, but we actually ask Him for very few things. Yet a child exhibits a magnificent boldness to ask! Our Lord said, “. . . unless you . . . become as little children . . .” (Matthew 18:3). Ask and God will do. Give Jesus Christ the opportunity and the room to work. The problem is that no one will ever do this until he is at his wits’ end. When a person is at his wits’ end, it no longer seems to be a cowardly thing to pray; in fact, it is the only way he can get in touch with the truth and the reality of God Himself. Be yourself before God and present Him with your problems—the very things that have brought you to your wits’ end. But as long as you think you are self-sufficient, you do not need to ask God for anything.

To say that “prayer changes things” is not as close to the truth as saying, “Prayer changes me and then I change things.” God has established things so that prayer, on the basis of redemption, changes the way a person looks at things. Prayer is not a matter of changing things externally, but one of working miracles in a person’s inner nature.

This is what makes Christianity so special; in Jesus Christ: Our sins are forgiven.

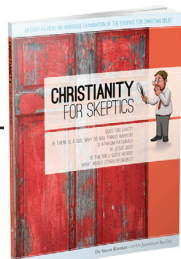
- Our guilt is removed

my teaching and then you would never have fallen." Mohammed advised, "Allah wills whatsoever he wills." Buddha came by and said, "It's all an illusion in the mind, change your mind and you will change the problem." Krishna came along and said, "It's your karma that you have fallen into the lake. You deserve it." Then Jesus Christ came. He did not give a lecture or some good advice. Dream Leads Entire Family To Jesus

With God *All Things Are Possible*...

It all began when their father died. The family mourned his passing and then the son who was best equipped to run the farm, took charge of the family as well, a task he took seriously.

Shortly afterward the son had a dream: He dreamed his father was speaking to him. His father told him that he had dreamed about Jesus just before he died. In his own dream, the son saw his father lying in the hospital. Suddenly, the door to his hospital room opened and Jesus appeared to the sick father, who was laying on his deathbed. Jesus said to him: If you believe in Me, I will give you real life." The son heard how his father replied: "Yes, I believe in you, but please go to my family. I have a big family." After this conversation with Jesus, the father surrendered his life to Jesus and peacefully passed away.

The dream made such an impression on the son that he invited the whole family to meet on the farm. His little sister seemed upset and refused to attend. In this closed country, as in many closed Muslim countries, sisters must be submissive to their fathers and brothers. The son was angry with his sister and called her to account: "Why don't you obey me? You have to accept my invitation. I am your brother." His little sister said she was afraid. "Why?" her brother asked. "I had a

special dream," she answered. She continued to share about how she saw her father meeting Jesus in her dream. The son listened in utter amazement as his sister recounted the exact same dream he had dreamt!

At the family meeting, both the son and his little sister shared their dreams with the rest of the family. Their testimony about Jesus appearing to them in separate dreams made such an impact on the family that they all accepted Jesus as Saviour. Afterward, the son decided to get each of them a Bible so they could learn more about their newfound faith.

But where does one find fifty Bibles in a remote area of a closed Muslim country?

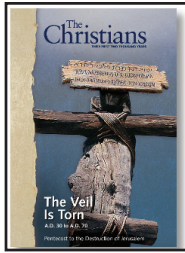
As it happens, the son heard about a shop in a nearby city that was said to sell Bibles. When he finally arrived at the shop, the shopkeeper told him that he could not help him with so many Bibles, but he did know someone else who could help. This other Christian could help. God had prepared someone to provide His Word and to disciple the family.

This is the type of account we are often told of but not often retold to protect the identity of new believers. Our field workers are certain that this particular Muslim family had a special encounter with God. God spoke directly to them through dreams... the same dream.

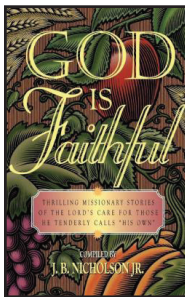

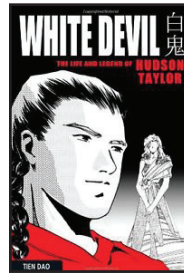

James Hudson Taylor (1832-1905) was a missionary to China, whose passionate commitment led to the founding of the China Inland Mission, now called the Overseas Missionary Fellowship. One of the first western missionaries to adopt Chinese dress (enduring the mockery of his colleagues) he served in China for 51 years, outliving two wives, and bringing at least 800 missionaries to the country. He personally baptised at least 50,000 converts and inspired the famous cricketer C.T. Studd to become a missionary, leading to the formation of the group known as the Cambridge Seven. This popular account, written and drawn by Christians in Hong Kong, introduces the Hudson Taylor story to a wholly new audience (lionhudson.com).
